Mayflower Descendants & the Civil War

The General Society of Mayflower Descendants' web site lists the following Notable Descendants:

<u>Ulysses S. Grant</u> (1822-1885) U.S. General & 18th President of the United States. Descendant of Pilgrim Richard Warren.

George B. McClellan (1826-1885) Major-General, Commander of the Union Forces, Civil War. Descendant of Pilgrims William Bradford and William Brewster.

Alonzo Hersford "Lon" Cushing (1841–1863) Lieutenant Colonel. Posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor in 2014, 151 years after his death. Descendant of Pilgrims John Alden, Francis Cooke, <u>Edward Fuller</u>,

Stephen Hopkins, William Mullins and Richard Warren.

** He was an artillery officer in the Union Army during the American Civil War. He died at the Battle of Gettysburg while defending the Union position on Cemetery Ridge against Pickett's Charge. Action was undertaken in 2013, 150 years after Cushing's death, to award him the Medal of Honor. The nomination was approved by the United States Congress, and was sent for review by the Defense Department and the President.

On August 26, 2014, the White House announced he would be posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor. President Obama awarded him the medal on November 6, 2014, in a White House ceremony attended by Cushing's distant cousins, Frederic Stevens Sater and Frederic Cushing Stevens III, and their families, although his closest relation was Helen Bird Loring Ensign, a first cousin twice removed. Cushing left no direct descendants.

A stone monument in honor of Cushing marks the spot where he was killed during the Battle of Gettysburg. The marker is located on Cemetery Ridge,



along Hancock Avenue, at The Angle.

Hoping some researching for our line will bring a better result than the first time around a few years ago! Here's a short recap...

Eli Fuller born in Pikes/Wayne Co PA about 1804/or 1807 depending on what document we believe...

Was in Sussex Co NJ by 1834 when he married Margaret Martin from Sussex Co NJ

They had Benjamin Martin Fuller in 1835

He married Amy Jones from North Vernon NJ in 1860

Their son George Benjamin Fuller was born in 1865 in Glenwood, Sussex Co NJ

He married Sarah Catherine Thornton of Sussex Co NJ

Their only son Lee William Fuller was born in 1885 in Sussex Co NJ

He married Anna May MacKenzie who was born in Bucks Co Pa, but was residing in Union Co NJ when they married in 1906.

Their son Lee William Fuller, born in Levin PA in 1915 married Helen Regina Fuller in Union Co NJ in 1939.

Their son is my husband, Lee W Fuller.

My husband's DNA matched Edward Fuller's descendant in the FTM Mayflower Fuller DNA Project, but we have yet to find out how or through whom, as none of the other participants have matched or supplied their tree.

Rews from St. Mary's Redenhall by Brenda Legrys

Dear Fuller Society,

The Friends decided to try to raise the profile of St. Mary's this year. Our congregations are small but we hope to persuade increasing numbers of people to see the building as a place where interesting things happen. We have already had an Organ Recital which demonstrated the full potential of our historic organ; also a tour of some of the most interesting memorials in our large churchyard; Gordon Lascelles set them in their context, including some 18th century Fullers, and we had a reading of poems related to the Pilgrim Fathers and the "Mayflower". Later in the year we shall host a String Quartet, a Choral Evensong, an Autumn Festival and an illustrated talk entitled Redenhall Revealed. Alongside this two of the Friends have opened their gardens for a Coffee Morning and a Tea Party – we are busy!

The verdict on our application for a grant to repair the part of the roof where there are 3 leaks is due at the end of June. We await this with a mixture of hope and dread.

We were pleased to welcome Lillian and Ted Bialy – Lillian is a Fuller descendant; they were able to hear the bells and the organ as well as making a thorough tour of St. Mary's and joining us for Holy Communion. If we know when visitors are coming we can help them to make the most of their time – so we await with interest details of Barbara Williams' tour in 2017.

The Fuller Society's 24th Annual Meeting will be held in Gettysburg, PA —October 5—9, 2016.


