A New Fuller Connection?

The following information was published in the Summer 2019 issue of the Mayflower Descendant published by the New England Historic Genealogical Society (NEHGS).

According to Y-DNA testing, Lt. John Sprague, ca. 1655—1727/8 of Duxbury, MA and Lebanon, CT was the illegitimate son of the Reverend Samuel Fuller, son of Dr. Samuel Fuller.

At the General Court in Plymouth on 6 June 1655, John Sprague and Ruth Bassett of Duxbury were "present(ed)" for fornication before they were married; they were cleared by paying the fine. Ruth and John's eldest child John was followed by six other children. Upon comparison of Y-DNA results between descendants of the eldest, John, and the younger two sons, Samuel and William, have shown that Lt. John Sprague was not the biological child of John Sprague.

In 2017 Christopher Child, who wrote this article, was asked by Mary Sprague Langsdorf to look into her late brother's DNA results. Mr. Child was surprised to find that although the results matched several members of the Sprague family, there were also a large number of matches to the Fuller family of Plymouth.

Of the seven Fuller men living in New England in 1655 that were old enough to father a child, only Rev. Samuel was living in Plymouth near Duxbury. Edward Fuller's sons Samuel and Matthew and were living in Barnstable. Thus Samuel Fuller, who was probably single and not yet a reverend, is the most likely father as he was the only Fuller male living near Ruth Bassett. No record has been found that connects Ruth to Samuel. Extensive DNA matches were performed the Sprague and Fuller family descendants.

The General Society of Mayflower Descendants is recognizing the results of Mr. Child's research and are accepting that Lt. John Sprague is the illegitimate son of Rev. Samuel Fuller. Beyond this generation, proof of descent is required to submit an application to Dr. Samuel through Rev. Samuel and John Sprague.

All essays should be 12 font, double spaced and <u>at least</u> 750 words. Failure to comply with any of the Fuller Society Scholarship rules will cause the application to be disqualified.

The applicant must be an active member or descended from an active member as of 10/31/19 to be eligible to apply.
