Governor Debbie

The 27th Annual Business Meeting of the Fuller Society was held at the Hyatt Place Philadelphia in King of Prussia on 19 Sep 2019.

Governor Deb Yingst welcomed everyone and Bill Wenzel gave the opening prayer. After reciting the Pilgrim Pledge, she offered a prayer for our recently departed members; Richard Albers, Harry Engleman and Donald Miller.

Governor Yingst introduced the Board of Assistants and noted that the IRS Form 990 and the annual report for the Maine Charter were filed as required. Governor Yingst also discussed the Fuller Society UK tour in July 2020 and reported she was able to obtain a reduction in the percentage paid to PayPal from 2. 9% down to 2.2% via non-profit pricing offered by PayPal.

Minutes: A motion was made by Bill Wenzel and seconded by Fred Swegles to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the 26th Annual Meeting in Cooperstown, NY. Motion passed.

Secretary's Report: Linda Hoffman reported there are a total of 283 members consisting of 197 regular and 86 life and that as of 13 Oct 2018 there have been 55 new members and 7 reinstated. She also noted that 29 members were dropped in 2019.

Treasurer Report: Marcia Shaw presented the Treasurer's report which shows the total equity for the Society is \$23, 746. Marcia also noted that to date the Society is about \$1000 ahead of last years' total even with the increase of the Scholarship to \$2020 and 2020 Fuller Memorial headstone monies in the JF Hoffman Fund. Carole Maida asked what the JF Hoffman fund was for, Governor Yingst explained it is used for projects approved by the board as well as lineage CD's. Cheryl House made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. John Yingst seconded. Motion approved.

Junior Chair Report: Roxy Pemrick reported that the Society has a total of 51 Juniors as of 2 Sep 2019 and since 13 Oct 2018 we have had 9 new Juniors. 10 letters were sent out to seniors encouraging them to apply for the Scholarship in 2019 and also join as regular members.

Scholarship Chair Report: Kim Skellie submitted her report on the 2019 Scholarship and thanked the committee for work in selecting a winner. Two essays were received and first place was awarded to Camden Buennemeyer and second place was awarded to Alyssa Rousseau.

Audit report: John Kemp conducted an audit of the Fuller Society Financial Records for 2018 and 1 Jan to 31 Dec 2019 and noted that after a careful examination of the financial records, he was able to report that the records are in good order and all transactions are well documented. Having no questions or concerns about the financial records, he commended the treasurer for accuracy, thoroughness and clarity of the records.

Donations: The Board of Assistants voted to send \$250 to The Samuel Fuller School in Middleboro, MA and \$250 to Nemasket Hill Cemetery where the Fuller Memorial headstone will be placed.

By-Laws: A discussion was held regarding the changes to the 2018 Board approved by-Laws that were published in the newsletter. John Kemp noted the changes were necessary to bring them up to date with current procedures. A motion was made by Ellie Lienau to amend Article IX adding "of those attending". John Yingst seconded, motion passed. Ellie also suggested removing "Section 1" from Article VIII Standing Committees as there is not a section 2. A motion to accept all the By-Law changes was made by John Yingst and seconded by Marcia Shaw. Motion passed.

Governor Yingst noted the 2020 Annual meeting will be held in Scituate, MA beginning on September 20th, 2020 with the ceremony dedicating the Fuller Memorial headstone in Nemasket Hill Cemetery. She also noted the top of the stone will be carved in the style of Nathaniel Fuller, a grandson of Rev. Samuel Fuller and gravestone carver in Middleboro, MA. The new stone will include Nathaniel's signature heart mouth and will also include memorial verbiage on the remainder of the front of the stone dedicated to Edward and Mrs. Fuller, their sons Samuel and Matthew and Dr. Samuel Fuller since there are no known headstones for any of them. The back of the stone will be etched with the Mayflower with the vital information of the Fullers. The stone will be placed between the Doty Memorial stone and the Rev. Samuel Fuller (son of Dr. Samuel Fuller) stone.

A motion was made by Bill Wenzel and seconded by Denise Wenzel to adjourn. Meeting adjourned.

You may not copy any text from outside sources. Sources must be cited in appropriate bibliographic form. Essays will be evaluated for accurate historical content, organization, and grammar. All essays should be 12 font, double spaced and <u>at least</u> 750 words. Failure to comply with any of the Fuller Society Scholarship rules will cause the application to be disqualified.

The applicant must be an active member or descended from an active member as of 10/31/19 to be eligible to apply.

The Fuller Memorial

Below is a depiction of the approved design for the Fuller memorial gravestone that will be placed in the Nemasket Hill Cemetery in Middleborough, MA next year. The front top of the stone will be a replica of a Nathaniel Fuller carving. Nathaniel was the great grandson of Dr. Samuel and a well known carver in Middleborough.
