Please remind the high school seniors in your family about the Fuller Society Scholarship.



#### The Cudworth House

Scituate, MA

Samuel Fuller and Jane Lothropp, daughter of Rev. John Lothropp, were married at the Cudworth house in Scituate on 8 April 1635 by Captain Myles Standish. On that same day Samuel was granted a four acre lot, the first lot on the north side of the Green Field,

The Cudworth House sits on land granted to Richard Garrett before 1646. In 1728 Jael Garrett sold the dwelling house and land to James Cudworth. Ownership passed to his grandson, Zephaniah, who built the present house in 1797 around the chimney of the original structure on the site. In 1851 Israel Thorndike purchased the property from the Cudworths, and in 1916 it became the property of the Town of Scituate. That same year the Scituate Historical Society formed, and the Town turned administrative control of the site over to the non-profit organization. I hope we can visit the Cudworth house next year.



## Keeping the Faith: A New Book written by Fuller Society member Elaine McDonald


"When the Mayflower sailed to America in 1620, four of the passengers were members of the Fuller family, originally from Redenhall, England. They were Edward Fuller, his wife, their 12-year-old son Samuel, and Edward's younger brother Samuel. Edward's other son, 15-year-old Matthew, remained behind and did not arrive in Plymouth Colony until almost 20 years later. This book tells the story of the struggle for religious freedom through the eyes of these family members, including Matthew Fuller's fight against the establishment of a state religion and the persecution of Quakers in the later years of Plymouth Colony.

The historical record of the Fuller family leaves many questions unanswered. How did Edward and his brother Samuel come to be part of the Separatist group now known as the Pilgrims? Why did Matthew remain behind? What caused him to wait almost 20 years before joining his younger brother in Plymouth Colony? This short novel imagines the answers to those questions and others, while remaining true to the known historical facts. The book includes an Appendix that summarizes the research upon which the fictional account is based." The book is available in a Kindle and paperback version at Amazon.com/dp/B08J1V8J9S.

The essay topic for the 2020 Bridget Lee Fuller Scholarship is:

## "What Mayflower Pilgrim do you best identify with and why? How does the Pilgrim's journey have meaning for us today?"

You may not copy any text from outside sources. Sources must be cited in appropriate bibliographic form. Essays will be evaluated for accurate historical content, organization, and grammar. All essays should be 12 font, double spaced and <u>at least</u> 750 words. Failure to comply with any of the Fuller Society Scholarship rules will cause the application to be disqualified.

The applicant must be an active member or descended from an active member as of 10/31/20 to be eligible to apply.

Why is the Fuller Society Scholarship named for Bridget Lee Fuller? Bridget Fuller arrived at Plymouth Colony on the ship Anne in 1623. She was Dr. Samuel Fuller's third wife, and they had two children together.

Bridget survived her husband for many years and did not remarry. Her name appears in the Plymouth Colony Records many times, as she acquired or traded land and livestock.

Bridget Fuller lived until after 1667, and exerted a strong influence on the educational life of Plymouth Colony.
